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CONDUCTOR - Dr DAVID G. HEBERT

Dr. David G. Hebert is an American musician who was brought to New Zealand to work as Head of Music for Te Wananga O Aotearoa, the nation's largest tertiary institution. A conductor and composer, he also performs as a jazz musician in the Auckland area, and plays trumpet in the Manukau City Symphony Orchestra and Auckland Symphony Orchestra. David holds a PhD degree in instrumental music education from the University of Washington, where he studied conducting under Timothy Salzman and instrumental pedagogy under Steven Morrison. His postdoctoral studies in the Saito Conducting Method were under maestro Norihisa Yamamoto in Tokyo. David previously taught music courses in Russia at Moscow State University, and in Japan at Tokyo Gakugei University, and served as Director of Research for the Kunitachi Gakki Music Institute.



David has conducted the University of Washington Concert Band, and served as Orchestra Director for the Peace Chamber Orchestra and University Presbyterian Church Orchestra, whose performances were frequently broadcast on Seattle radio. As an Artist in Residence supported by the Michigan State Council for the Arts, David twice served as Director of the Joyful Noise Band. He has also conducted bands and orchestras as a music teacher for Seattle public schools, and his research on music teaching is published in the leading scholarly journals for music education. David also composes orchestral music, and in 2003 conducted the premiere of his first opera "Correspondence" in Tokyo. Tonight is his first public appearance as a conductor in New Zealand.

SOLOIST - CHRISTINE CHANG



Christine Chang is studying for her Bachelor of Music Honours degree with Professor Uwe Grodd. Christine is a flute tutor at Howick School of Music and also teaches flute at Rangitoto College and St Peter's College. Last year she was second in the Unison Concerto Competition - an annual national competition held in Rotorua, and in the same competition she was also awarded Best Woodwind Player. She won the Open 20th Century category of the Auckland Flute Society/KBB Flute Competitions in 2002, and last year won the Open concerto category for the second time. Christine's hobbies are all connected with music and include playing jazz flute, a pursuit for which she won Best Jazz Flautist at the 2001 Tauranga Jazz Festival.
