This activity was against the law, and they knew that a severe beating or even death could face them if they were caught. But the joy and peace that they received in these meetings made it worth the risk they faced.

Laura Pendergrast recently completed a Bachelor of Music in performance trumpet at the University of Auckland under the tutelage of APO principal trumpet Brent Grapes. She has played casually with Bach Musica and the Auckland Philharmonia Orchestra and appeared as a concerto soloist with the Auckland Symphony Orchestra. Laura has been principal trumpet of Auckland Youth Orchestra and Auckland Wind Orchestra and currently plays with Auckland City Brass Band. At the end of 2012 she is heading to Denmark to pursue further studies.

ONE VOICE CHOIR

One Voice was established in 1999 and is an auditioned choir based in central Auckland although its members are drawn from all over the Auckland area. Musical Director is Olga Tarasenko who is a music graduate from the Russian Conservatory system. Olga has brought a new approach to the "World Music" which informs the Choir's repertoire. Songs are drawn from Russia, Georgia, and Italy supplemented by both American and British songs as well as traditional Maori ones. The Choir's songs are generally presented in a *cappella* form but in recent times appropriate instruments have been added to some of the songs bringing a new colour to established vocal numbers.
